Guest Lecturer/Preacher Coming to St.

<u>Matthew</u>— On Superbowl weekend, we have the great pleasure of hosting Dr. Deirdre Good, Professor of New Testament at the General Theological Seminary in New York City who is a specialist in the Synoptic Gospels, Christian Origins, Non-canonical writings and biblical

languages (Greek and Coptic). Her powerful book, <u>Jesus the Meek King</u> was a great influence on Fr. Haynes as a means of unpacking the role of earthly power in Jesus day in contrast to his divine virtues.
