St. Matthew and AT&T come to agreement regarding "Cell Tower" lease...

On Wednesday, December 17 at a special meeting preceding the Parish Life Committee Meeting, your Vestry voted with 6 "yeas" and 1 "nay" (with two members being absent) to enter into an agreement with AT&T to lease a portion of our property to AT&T for the construction of a Cell Tower (Tree), which will bring much improved cell phone and data service to the Browns Point area as well as

needed revenue to the parish. With this agreement in place, AT&T can now move forward with a public rezoning meeting, as required by Pierce County. Assuming positive results from the rezoning meeting AT&T will then be able to start construction sometime in the coming year.

The opportunity for this lease came to us back in November of 2013. After much study and review/editing of the agreement, along with constructive meetings with our parishioners and the property owners from around the church that would be most affected, the Vestry felt that it was ready to move forward.

As was shared this last Sunday, a heavily weighed part of the data gathering process was the feelings of our neighbors about the project. The neighborhood meeting, which was held on Tuesday, December 9th, was very helpful in gathering this information. In review, this meeting was not required by the county. While the number of people attending was small, we couldn't have asked for better representation. Three homeowners whose properties sit directly across from the Church, two in person and one by letter, had the opportunity to listen to representatives of Cascadia/AT&T explain via the exact same presentation the parish received on September 14th as to why the tower is being constructed and what it will look like when completed. We also had an Environmental & Physicist present who reviewed the areas regarding the health related issues. The subjects discussed by the homeowners covered view, health, coverage and what other options might be available. It was very clear that they were appreciative of the fact that St Matthew gave them the opportunity to be heard. In the end the two homeowners (3 people) present said while still opposed to the construction they were not interested in stopping the parish from moving forward.

Given the data collected and the weighing of costs and benefits, your Vestry feels that this cell tower lease is in the end a sustainable opportunity in helping us continue to be a light of Christ in the neighborhood. The Vestry thanks all who have prayerfully participated in the process to date and will continue to keep you informed as the project continues to develop.
