The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ According to Luke (24:36b-48)

Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Jesus himself stood among the disciples and their companions and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. It was a proud moment for our parish to have everyone work together, in the absence of our pastor, to provide a Holy Week that was special for all of us. Thank you!

Phoenix Housing Project - The Phoenix Housing Network is a Catholic Community Services program that provides temporary housing to selected homeless families in transition to permanent housing. Churches throughout the community assist with secure overnight sites for one week at a time providing evening meals, continental breakfasts and a warm, welcoming and secure setting. The families are responsible for their own transportation: their own car or bus.

St Joseph/St John Episcopal church in Lakewood has hosted Phoenix families for several years. St Matthew church does not have access to public transportation so could not be used as a host resource. However if anyone would like to help in this endeavor, St Joseph/St John could use (needs) volunteer help such as:

An evening meal for about 10 adults and 8-10 children.

Overnight hosting - some one to sleep on site and prepare breakfast.
