

Second Lesson: 1 Corinthians 1:18-31

The message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those

who believe. For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength. Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are, so that no one might boast in the presence of God. He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."





New Refrigerator Update

The new refrigerator has been installed and is working great. As was mentioned a couple of months back, our 44 year old Traulsen commercial refrigerator in the parish hall kitchen has met its useful end in that it no longer refrigerates below 40°F. Between our sexton and our rector, some 40 vendors were researched nationwide to find the best replacement for this appliance. We have found the best deal for the exact replacement at Bargreen-Ellingson Restaurant Equipment & Supplies right here in Tacoma. The cost is \$2994.82 [MSRP \$8170.00] which included free shipping and no sales tax. This is a significant capital expenditure and it is requested of the parish to cover the cost above our budget. Monies collected earlier for "the shed" (approximately \$250.00) have been applied to the refrigerator. So far we have received \$1,340! Keep up the good work! Thank you!
