**The Nicene Creed**

Will you be faithful in your commitment to Jesus Christ by regular attendance at worship, by regular prayer, by serving Christ in others, and by stewardship of the parish?

**The Vestry:** I will.

**The Rector to the Clerk:**

The Clerk will now present the Vestry for commissioning.

**The Clerk:**

I present to you these persons to be admitted to the ministry of Wardens and Members of the Vestry of St. Mary's Episcopal Church.

**The Rector:**

Let us Pray.

O Eternal God, the foundation of all wisdom and the source of all courage: Enlighten with your grace the Wardens and Vestry of this parish, and so enrich their minds, and guide their counsels, that in all things they may seek your glory,

promote the mission of your Church, and live in your peace, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**Eucharistic Prayer C**

**Celebrant:** The Lord be with you.  
**People:** And also with you.  
**Celebrant:** Lift up your hearts.  
**People:** We lift them to the Lord.  
**Celebrant:** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**People:** It is right to give him thanks and praise.

God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise.  
*Glory to you for ever and ever.*

At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home.  
*By your will they were created and have their being.*

From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.  
*Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.*

Again and again, you called us to return. Through prophets and sages you revealed your righteous Law. And in the fullness of time you sent your only Son, born of a woman, to fulfill your Law, to open for us the way of freedom and peace.  
*By his blood, he reconciled us. By his wounds, we are healed.*

And therefore we praise you, joining with the heavenly chorus, with prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and with all those in every generation who have looked to you in hope, to proclaim with them your glory, in their unending hymn:
