

First Lesson: Daniel 7:9-10,13-14

As I watched, thrones were set in place, and an Ancient One took his throne, his clothing was white as snow, and the hair of his head like pure wool; his throne was fiery flames, and its wheels were burning fire. A stream of fire issued and flowed out from his presence. A thousand thousands served him, and ten thousand times ten thousand stood attending him. 

God of all power, Ruler of the Universe, you are worthy of glory and praise. Glory to you for ever and ever.



And now, as our Savior Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say,


Our Father, who art in heaven,
